The Telecommunication Development Bureau (BDT) is responsible for the organization and coordination of the work of the Telecommunication Development Sector (ITU-D) of the Union which deals mainly with ICT-focused development policies, strategies and programmes, as well as technical cooperation activities, to promote digital inclusion and drive digital transformation at community, country and regional levels. To effectively and efficiently serve the needs of ITU members, BDT is organized into four functional areas:

- Office of the Deputy to the Director and Field Operations Coordination Department
- Partnerships for Digital Development Department
- Digital Networks & Society Department
- Digital Knowledge Hub Department

Organization Unit:

The Digital Networks & Society Department is responsible for BDT activities in the areas of spectrum management, network development, cybersecurity, and emergency telecommunications. This department is also responsible for supporting ITU Member States in their transition to digital societies by providing tools and guidelines to address environmental challenges (in particular, climate change and e-waste), and for promoting innovation, ICT

applications/services, digital inclusion, and ecosystems, with the ultimate goal to 'leave no one behind'.

Duties / Responsibilities

Under the supervision of the Head of the Environment and Emergency Telecommunications Division, the incumbent will perform the following duties:

- Coordinate the BDT programme of work on the Circular Economy for Electronics related
 to waste electrical and electronic equipment (WEEE) activities of the thematic priority on
 "Environment" to ensure all regions and operations relating to this subject matter are in
 line with the overall theory of change of the thematic priority, by liaising directly and
 expanding activities with regional focal points and project managers from across the
 Bureau.
- Lead in the Bureau's activities related to national WEEE management policy technical assistance at the country level to create a productive and efficient environment for policy and regulatory development by ITU Member States, by working closely with ITU regional offices and their constituent ICT Ministries and ICT Regulators.
- Develop the circular economy related workload of the "Environment" thematic priority to expand the Bureau's portfolio in this area and to grow the concept of closed loop management of resources among the ICT sector and other electronics manufacturers and service providers, in particular by leading the Bureau's role in the E-waste Coalition and the Circular Electronics Partnership.
- Coordinate the consultants and experts carrying out WEEE data support and WEEE
 policy support related activities of the Bureau, by also working closely with the partners
 of the E-waste Coalition and the Global E-waste Statistics Partnership, to promote the
 combination of strengthened capacity building, simultaneously, on both WEEE policy
 and WEEE data at the country level.
- Conduct continued outreach, partnership development and fundraising at the national, regional and international level, in collaboration with the E-waste Coalition, ITU regional offices and other ITU sectors, to strengthen the WEEE and circular economy related partnership network of the Bureau, with the objective to keep at the forefront of thinking and seize new opportunities, first, when they arise and to develop new BDT projects on the circular economy.
- Steer all new WEEE related research activities of the "Environment" thematic priority to ensure that the Bureau's outreach materials, such as reports and thought papers, remain at the forefront of thinking, by identifying the gaps in current international discourse and the interests of the private sector and governments in overcoming the barriers of transitioning to a circular economy for electronics.
- Organize, plan, and coordinate ICT-related meetings and seminars, in close cooperation
 with the ITU Regional Offices and identify new and forward-looking topics and liaise
 with speakers and experts.
- Ensure that the Division's web site which is aimed at supporting and promoting the EET Division's activities is kept up-to-date; identify innovative approaches and make recommendations on ways to improve the dissemination of relevant information.
- Perform other related duties as assigned.

Competencies

- Core Competencies: Applying Expertise; Effective Communication; Learning and Knowledge Sharing; Organizational Commitment; Results-Focused, and; Teamwork and Collaboration.
- Essential Functional Competencies: Analysis, Judgement and Decision Making; Client and Service Orientation; Innovation and Facilitating Change; Planning and Organizing, and; Successful Management.
- Essential Technical Competencies: Knowledge of the international WEEE management sector and the actors operating in this field. Experience in developing national WEEE management policies and engaging stakeholders in this development. Understanding of all the key WEEE regulatory framework concepts, financing models and responsibilities. Familiarity with all the key definitions and concepts, such as extended producer responsibility, and those relating to WEEE management and the circular economy. Exposure previously to leading circular economy for electronics initiatives at the international level. Expertise in the forefront areas of the WEEE management discussion where barriers to improvement exist.

Qualifications required

Education:

Advanced university degree in a branch of ICTs/telecommunications, engineering, international cooperation, environmental sciences, environmental management, business management or international policy or a related field OR education from a reputed college of advanced education with a diploma of equivalent standard to that of an advanced university degree in one of the fields above. For internal candidates, a first university degree in one of the fields above in combination with seven years of qualifying experience may be accepted in lieu of an advanced university degree for promotion or rotation purposes.

Experience:

At least five years of progressively responsible experience in the fields of activity of the post, including in developing countries, and at least two years at the international level. A Doctorate in a related field can be considered as a substitute for two years of working experience. Proven experience in drafting and working in English.

Languages:

Knowledge of one of the six official languages of the Union (Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian, Spanish) at advanced level and knowledge of a second official language at intermediate level. Knowledge of a third official language would be an advantage. (Under the provisions of Resolution No. 626 of the Council, a relaxation of the language requirements may be authorized in the case of candidates from developing countries: when candidates from such countries possess a thorough knowledge of one of the official languages of the Union, their applications may be taken into consideration.)

Salary:

Total annual salary consists of a net annual salary (net of taxes and before medical insurance and pension fund deductions) in US dollars and a post adjustment (PA) (cost of living allowance). The PA is variable and subject to change without notice in accordance with the rates as set
